COSTA BLANCA MOUNTAIN WALKERS - WALK DESCRIPTION

The path swings back around to the L behind the hut (which is not visited) and later descends a little to reach a bridge. 4.1km, 1hr 24min Cross this and walk down to the R (signed Puerto de Chistal GR11.2) Cross a second bridge and turn R for a few metres before turning up the hill to intercept a footpath which turns L and starts to rise on the RHS of the valley - Barranco de Chistau. Arrive at the col at the top - Puerto de Chistau - (which is further than it initially appears) and turn slightly R. 7.1km, 2hr 10min Run level for a few hundred metres before turning down through rough scree before soon arriving at a majestic grassy valley. Cross and re-cross the stream several times before arriving at a stream junction where vou cross to the LHS of the Rio Estos. 9.7km, 2hr 52min Rise slightly through thickets of Juniper and continue ahead at a finger post before finally arriving at the Refugio de Estos. (not open for refreshments until mid-late pm!!) 12.4km, 3hr 31min (On the way to the Refuge note several streams on the far side of the valley which emerge from under boulders without having a watercourse from higher up the mountain!) Walk past the refuge and zig-zag down to be nearer to the river on some paved sections of path (allowing a small tractor to bring in supplies!) Cross a bridge to the R and soon arrive at a small cottage (Cabana del Tarmo) on L with benches and a car park! 14.9km, 4hr 3min Continue ahead without crossing the river on a track that soon rises slightly to go through a gate and round the end of a spur and turns R. A few metres down this look out for a footpath (optional) which allows you to visit several waterfall viewpoints. If you continue ahead on the footpath you will re-join the track. Continue downhill for several kilometres to reach a junction with car parking where we continue L and down hill. 18.7km, 4hr Pass the Cabana de Santa Ana – a small bothy equipped with loft sleeping platform and table and fire with kindling. 55min Cross a bridge to the L and soon arrive at a hydro building with lagoon now on a 20.2km, 5hr concrete road. 12min At a small cairn on the RHS you can follow a footpath down to the large car park below, walk across this and re-join the tarmac road (or continue down the concrete with the same result).

Continue ahead to reach a junction on the RHS with a hilly driveway that leads you to accommodation at the Hostal Parque Natural – a pretty family run establishment.
