Quickly reach the first of the Ermitas opposite a National Park information office.	2.7km, 1hr 5min		
Just before this a footpath with green sign takes off below the Ermita to the L signed "Circuito de las Ermitas". (3 more to come!)			
Follow this uphill in a few zig-zags and cross a shallow col before turning L up along a wooded path (box bushes) that can be muddy. (Views of the 3 sisters and Anisclo).	3km, 1hr 12min		
Reach a junction just above an open plateau with Ermita (Ermita de San Juan y San Pablo) in the middle distance on a small hill – which you can visit.	3.5km, 1hr 21min
