Directions to Start	Start at the N end of Carrer Major at its junction with Ave. de Joan Marti – the original road through the town and NOT the bypass.	
Short walk description	A long and challenging day winding up a long and beautiful valley to arrive at this high level refuge with no road access.

Note – finger-post times are shown as a matter of record to indicate where you are – not to advise on achievable times!! From the bridge over the river make your way out to the main town road beside the tourist information office and cross it directly into Carrer Major.		
Turn L beside the church – Esglesia de Sant Miguel.		
Turn R at the top and slightly downhill in the Carrer where we go straight across and onto a track.	de l'Arena to reach a roundabout

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Pass a finger-post to Cami del Fener de L'Olla (sp. ?) and ignore this and keep uphill in zig-zags.

Finally reach 2 restaurants at the end of the lake – La Dama del Lac on the RHS gets the | 2.7km, 1hr 10min morning sun.

Walk along a track on the S side of the lake and pass a small parking area now continuing uphill on tarmac to crest a small spur with a building on the corner and then descending back to the L.

3.6km, 1hr 21min

Reach a T-inc and turn R around a bend but leave this L and level at a finger-post.

4.1km, 1hr 29min

Pass a font and then a track down on the L which we ignore and keep ahead and level.

Pass a mirador on a spur on the RHS and then shortly after this another font and footpath on the R which we ignore and swing around to the L towards the barranco.

Reach a picnic area and continue slightly uphill on the L still in forest and then quickly reach a junction where you continue L uphill.

Reach a finger-post where you continue ahead (signed Coll Jovell) still uphill.

Walk over a spur - Coll Jovell - and down on the other side.

6.4km, 2hr 11min

After a considerable descent pass above a walled farm down below you on the RHS and an open bothy on the L now walking level. Soon reach a finger-post where you turn L again uphill.

7.4km, 2hr 25min

As you pass over some rocky slabs close to the stream you will find a walled enclosure on the LHS and then a building on the L signed as Borda de l'Estall.

Reach a finger-post showing Refugio de l'Illa as 2hr 30mins!!

Pass through a stile and electric fence and then through a gate with open pastures beyond and a refugio above on your LHS – Font Verd. Pass through another gate with a 9.3km, 3hr 11min locked bothy soon afterwards on the RHS.

At a finger-post at a bridge (we do not cross) we continue ahead (Refugio d'Illa – 1hr 55mins)

Pass a finger-post cross-roads (now 1hr 45min) Pass through a fenced stile and gate in rapid succession to walk into an open pasture still rising gently uphill.

Follow this path now past the Refugio Riu dels Oms (on the RHS in open pastures – Elm in English!) and continue starting to rise more steeply again.

13.8km, 4hr 40min


These higher sections are wonderfully attractive but you may be too tired to appreciate them!!

Eventually crest a small spur and look across to the refuge nestling on a crag. In 2016 this was undergoing major works which looked unlikely to be finished before Spring 2017!!


Walk Recommendations or restrictions
