Follow these steeply uphill and turn half R at the top to emerge at the edge of Plaza Santa Maria. (Best place to start and finish the walk)		1.1km, 17min

Cross the plaza and walk into the ruined church courtyard (if it is open) and after exploring emerge on the R and turn L and quickly fork L signed to Molino de Faraga. Pass the casa and keep L beside the river (on its RHS) and at a sign board for El Gillillo keep L.

At a fork where there is a bridge crossing the river to the L, ignore this and keep on the RHS of the river signed to Rio Cerezuelo.

Ignore the first bridge where you could cross L and keep ahead but at the next bridge you must cross and then quickly re-cross the river. The going underfoot along here can be slippery and climbs and falls quite a bit.

Just beyond a large building above you on the LHS reach a path junction where you turn 2.5km, 46min R and climb steadily.

Double back to the L and a viewpoint beside a fence which you walk around and then trend slightly L only a few metres to walk uphill beside a second fence on the L and follow this as the path levels somewhat high above a deep barranco down on your LHS.

Sections of this section are slippery and need care as the drop off is considerable, but with diligence you will find yourself below a large white building above you on the R and here you can climb directly up to this and follow a thin track L before the building to join a wider track where you turn R.

3.2km, 1hr 3min

Follow this as it swings around passing several miradors to meet a large building (hotel) where you turn R still on the same track and walk uphill to meet a track junction. (at the end of the tarmac and beside a set of gates)

4.7km, 1hr 27min

Cross this directly to find a finger post and follow the footpath up into the trees.

Cross the track again and continue on the footpath.

This soon swings R and then after a while back to the L now clearly on an engineered path.

When you meet a more major track turn R along this.

5.6km, 1hr 43min

Continue along this until you reach a gated track dropping on the RHS and take this.

6.2km, 1hr 52min

Follow this downhill and pass a finger post showing a path out to the Castillo de Cinco Esquinas which makes an interesting out and back extension.

Follow the main track downhill soon approaching the Ermita de Monte Sion.

7.3km, 2hr 8min

Just before reaching this turn R at a finger post (2.9km to Cazorla) on a descending track which falls rapidly with zig-zags and then contours around to the R passing a building - Borbotones and keep descending.

Eventually this becomes concrete and you reach a finger post at a T junction where you turn R.

Keep ahead on tarmac and through several sets of traffic lights to arrive back at the Plaza de Santa Maria.
